

# Wells, BC

- Cariboo Gold Rush 1868
- Barkerville 5,000 max

- Wells 1930s Gold Rush
  - **4,500** residents in 1930s

■ Population ~250







### **Ghost Town or Cultural Hub**

- 2003 government cut back results in media campaign
- "Province has traditionally seen the arts as an urban entity that is disseminated to rural areas" Judy Campbell, Barkerville CEO
- 2008 "Art as Engine for Small Towns: In rural BC, arts and culture are fueling future plans"





## Wells, BC – Arts. History. Adventure.

- Island Mountain Arts
  - Summer School of the Arts 1977 (175 students)
  - Int'l Harp School and Toni Onley Artists' Project
  - ArtsWells Festival Of All Things Art 2004 (160 acts, 12 stages, 2,000+ attendees)
  - Artist residence in new building 2015







# South Temiskaming, Ontario

- Settlers arrived in late 1800s
  - Hudson Bay fur trade
  - Mining (gold, silver)
  - Forestry
  - Agriculture
  - Tourism
- 10,000 Temiskaming Shores

- First Nations, Métis, English,French
- Matachewan First Nation (Ojibway and Cree)
- Timiskaming First Nation (Algonquin)

- Haliburton County Economic Development






# Haliburton County Community Co-operative

# Importance of contribution of the arts and arts community to life in your community




### Affiliated with an arts group



- Niches (Int'l Harp School)





- Sustainability: adequately paid staff








# **Integration with Community**

### Role in making Haliburton a community where arts thrive

#### Role in making Temiskaming a community where arts thrive

Temiskaming (N=56) Audiences (local) 88% Attitude of collaboration among arts community 77% Strong volunteer base for the arts 71% A local arts marketplace 71% Sponsors and donors 64% Partnerships between arts and other organizations 70% Arts-related infrastructure 64% Diversification across arts genres 71% Education and professional training locally 55% Municipal/county funding for the arts 64% Skilled arts administrators 55% Consistently strong political support 70% Concentration within an arts genre 46%
